Student Services

Tardy Policy

Students are to be in their seat before the tardy bell rings. Students who are late will be sent to the tardy sweep room for the remainder of the period. Tardy sweep will be held every period of the day. Six minutes are allotted between classes. **Students who are habitually tardy will receive one or more of the following consequences: detention, in-house suspension, Saturday school, or may be placed on the “No Go” list.** In addition parents and students may have to attend a truancy meeting and may be referred to the Student Attendance Review Team (SART) or Student Attendance Review Board (SARB) for further action. Students with habitual attendance issues may also be cited by the Lakewood Sheriff's Department.

Attendance

All students, regardless of their age, are expected to attend school regularly and be on time for classes, benefiting from the instructional program, while developing habits of punctuality, self-discipline, and responsibility.

If absent, students must bring a note, or have a parent/guardian call the attendance office within two weeks. When a student has accrued six or more unexcused period absences or tardies, they may be assigned one or more of the following: detention, in-house suspension, Saturday school, or may be placed on the “No Go” list. In addition, students with habitual attendance problems will be referred to a parent conference, School Attendance Review Team (SART), or School Attendance Review Board (SARB) at the Bellflower courthouse.

Mayfair High School is a closed campus. Students may not leave the school grounds during the school day. If there is a need to leave school during the day, such as for a dental appointment, students must be signed out through the attendance office or Middle School Office by a parent/guardian or an adult designated on your emergency card.

Cell Phone Policy

Cellular phones and other electronic devices must remain **out of sight** or in a carrying case and remain **powered “OFF”** when not being used for instructional purposes in the classroom, except when being used for a valid instructional or other school-related purpose as determined by the teacher or other school site staff. When devices are in use, they shall remain in silent mode unless otherwise specified. Students may not use or display cell phones and other electronic devices in classrooms or during participation in school activities, during the instructional day, unless specifically authorized by a school administrator or designee. Any device with camera, video, or voice recording function shall not be used in any manner, which infringes on the privacy rights of any other person. Cellular devices and other electronic devices may be used on campus during snack, lunch, before school, and or after school as long as it does not cause a disruption.

Bicycles, Skateboards, Scooters & Helmets

Students who ride bicycles, skateboards and scooters to school must observe these safety rules:

- Students must wear helmets.
- Students may not ride their bikes, skateboards or scooters on campus.
- Students must lock their bike helmets to their bikes or place them in their backpacks.
- **Students must put their bikes, skateboards and scooters in the bike rack. Students may not lock their bikes to other bikes.**
- **Bikes, skateboards or scooters may not be stored in classrooms.**
- The bike rack is locked from 7:45 am-2:36 pm. **Mayfair is not responsible for loss or theft of bicycles, skateboards, or scooters.**

Dress Code

1. No extreme alterations in physical appearance that causes a distraction in the educational environment.
2. No Facial/body piercings (tongue, eyebrow, cheek, lip, etc.) except for ears and a nose stud. Piercings may not be covered by bandages.
3. Appropriate undergarments must be worn with outer garments concealing undergarments. Tank style shirts must be at least two inches wide to cover bra straps. No sheer blouses or bra-less outfits are allowed. No low neckline or back line, bare midriff, bathing suits, beach attire, tight or revealing, or strapless garments.
4. Skirts, dresses, and shorts must be fingertip length or longer and long enough to cover undergarments when bending or sitting.
5. No bedroom slippers, pajamas, or blankets.
6. Clothing and hair must be clean and neat. Baggy, or oversized clothing are not allowed. Pants must stay up when hands are raised. No sagging. Men's shirts may not be longer than finger tip length. Students are permitted to have holes or fraying in their pants or shorts as long as it is below finger tip length.
7. Extreme hairstyles that cause a distraction to the learning environment are not allowed.
The administrator has authority to determine what an extreme hairstyle is.
8. No studded gloves, wristbands, or accessories. No handcuffs may be worn. No wallet chains.
9. No hats or headgear may be worn, except for district approved hats or beanies. (See the Monsoon Spirit Wear Policy below.)
10. No gang* related apparel or accessories are allowed including clothing, bandanas, wristbands, shoestrings, jewelry, symbols, paraphernalia, or materials that evidence membership in or affiliation with any gang/crew/posse. * A gang is defined as a group or individual who advocates and practices unlawful behavior or is counterproductive to the education and welfare of students.
11. Tattoos or symbols permanently affixed that exhibit gang/crew/posse affiliation must be covered.
12. School policy prohibits the wearing or displaying of symbols that:
 - a. Express or advocate, racial, ethnic, or religious prejudice.
 - b. Incite students to commit unlawful acts.
 - c. Are obscene, vulgar, or profane.
 - d. Advertise alcoholic beverages, drugs, or violence.
 - e. Are sexually suggestive or explicit.

Monsoon Spirit Wear Policy

Mayfair Middle/High will permit students to wear hats/spirit wear on campus in order to protect students from the sun and promote school pride. All students are required to adhere to the following guidelines when wearing Monsoon spirit wear:

- Hats/beanies may only be worn outside of school buildings. Hats/beanies worn inside buildings during academic instruction may be confiscated.
- Students may only wear authorized Monsoon spirit wear with NO added insignias, writing, or alterations.
- Authorized ASB organizations include hats/beanies sold in the Mayfair accounting office, by a school athletic team, or otherwise approved by ASB.
- Students may not wear any other hats or beanies. Hats/beanies with commercial logos are not permitted.
- Students may not wear any hats/beanies that have been altered.

Students who violate any part of the Monsoon Spirit Wear Policy will be given the opportunity to remove the hat, beanie or other head covering. If this corrective action does not result in a positive outcome, students will be considered to be in defiance of authority and additional disciplinary action will be imposed.

Lost and Found

Middle School lost and found is located in the Middle School Office. High School lost and found is located in the High School Office. Additionally, each locker room has a lost and found. Always check these locations when you have misplaced an item. If you have checked lost and found and still have not located your item, please fill out a report.

Telephone

Emergency phone calls may be placed in the Middle School, High School or Main Office.

Health Services

Health assistants are available in the Health Office during school hours. If a student becomes ill at school he/she may report to the Health Office after receiving a pass from the teacher. Medicine, which must be taken during school hours, must be left in the Health Office in its original container along with written orders from the doctor and a signed parental consent form. All medicine, whether prescription or over-the-counter, must be turned into the Health Office. Students may come to the Health Office to take their medicine at the prescribed time. We want to be assured that medication for students is administered under safe conditions, as per Education Code Section 49423. A school form granting permission to take medication shall be signed by a parent/guardian who will also label all medication.

Transportation Services

Bus service is provided for students in 7th and 8th grade only. The bus picks up from your assigned bus stop to school and home if you live inside the district boundaries, but more than 2 miles from Mayfair. You will need to present your ID card each time you board your bus. Be at your designated stop before the bus arrives and wait until the driver asks you to board the bus. Students who do not follow the bus rules will be removed from the bus. Bus riders are under the authority of, and directly responsible to the bus driver (State Reg. 1086).

ID Cards

Students must carry a Mayfair Middle/High School identification card whenever on campus during school or at a campus event. This card will be required to receive textbooks, ride the bus, and to check out library books. Seniors who leave campus before the end of the school day must show their ID card to be released. Students must present their I.D. card when requested by a staff member. The card is not transferable to any other person and may not be altered in any way. Any lost card should be reported immediately so that a replacement card can be issued. There is a \$5.00 charge to replace lost I.D. cards.

Accounting Office

The accounting office is open Monday through Friday from 7:00 am - 1:30 pm. Purchases may be made with cash, debit card, check, or credit card. Checks are accepted through May 15th. Purchases may also be made on-line at our WebStore. A 6% processing fee is charged by the web host for purchases made through the WebStore.

Physical Education Department

Uniform

A regulation physical education uniform consists of t-shirt, shorts, sweatshirt, sweatpants, white socks (colored stripes acceptable on socks), and lace or velcro athletic shoes (no slip-on). Uniforms may be purchased through the accounting office or on-line at the WebStore. Students who already have a uniform from last year are not required to purchase a new one. All uniform articles must be permanently marked with the student's name (last name, first name) to aid in the return of lost or misplaced P.E. clothes. **P.E. clothes must be taken home regularly to be laundered.** Any torn clothing must be replaced or repaired.

Locks and Lockers

A locker with a built-in lock is issued to each student. It is **HIGHLY** suggested that you put your own additional lock on your locker while in P.E. Mayfair Middle/High School must be able to open any locker at any time. **Students must never leave their belongings in the locker unlocked, never share lockers, or give their combination to anyone. The school is not responsible for loss or damage to items students bring to school.**

Co-Curricular Programs, Athletics, & Clubs

All students elected to student office or who represent their school in extracurricular and co-curricular activities shall demonstrate minimum progress in meeting the requirements for graduation and have and maintain good citizenship, attendance, and an average letter grade of "C" in all subjects 7-12. Any student who fails to do so shall not be allowed to represent fellow students or the school for a period of time as determined by the student's principal, but in not case, except when approved by the Board of Education shall the time exceed twelve calendar months. 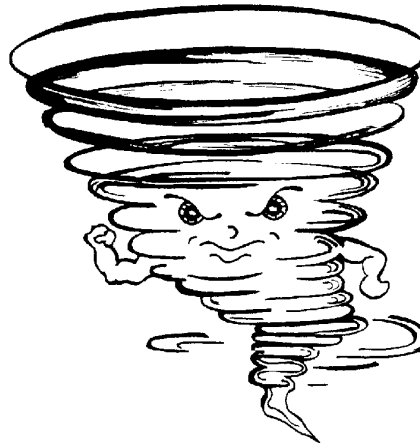

UC/CSU a-g Subject Requirements

Courses must be completed with a grade of “C” or better

- **History/social science (“a”)** – *Two years*, including one year of world history, cultures and historical geography and one year of U.S. history, or one-half year of U.S. history and one-half year of American government or civics.
- **English (“b”)** – *Four years* of college preparatory English that integrates reading of classic and modern literature, frequent and regular writing, and practice listening and speaking.
- **Mathematics (“c”)** – *Three years* of college-preparatory mathematics that include or integrate the topics covered in elementary and advanced algebra and two- and three-dimensional geometry.
- **Laboratory science (“d”)** – *Two years* of laboratory science providing fundamental knowledge in at least two of the three disciplines of biology, chemistry and physics.
- **Language other than English (“e”)** – *Two years* of the same language other than English or equivalent to the second level of high school instruction.
- **Visual and performing arts (“f”)** – *One year* chosen from dance, music, theater or the visual arts.
- **College-preparatory elective (“g”)** – *One year* chosen from the “a-f” courses beyond those used to satisfy the requirements above, or courses that have been approved solely in the elective area.

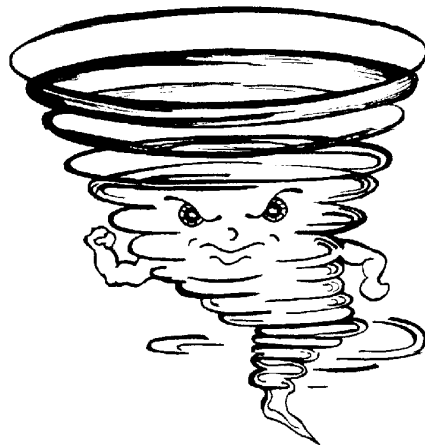
